What is Heart Rhythm?








Heart Rhythm issues – often referred to as arrhythmias –relate to the heart’s electrical system. When a person experiences cardiac arrest, the electrical current that controls the timing and pace of the heart beat is disrupted, which stops the heart from pumping.

For some, when left untreated, arrhythmias can be extremely dangerous and lead to loss of consciousness or even death.
